Message from our Chair



2020 saw the world come to a standstill with the Covid 19 pandemic reaching unprecedented worldwide proportions. People were unable to gather and care for each other face to face. The world went virtual and with the colossal spread of the virus and death came colossal grief. Complicated grief.

This situation cemented our mission of creating a larger online presence for our community and beyond as online has no boundaries, and our vision to support anyone on their grieving journey. The focus of Oasis during this time has been on creating an online presence for our community where people can find support as they grieve. We completed the work on our new website and it was successfully launched in December with 10 community organizations partnering with us. We have been working hard to get our community calendar up and running so grieving members of our community need only go to one place to find the variety of supports available to them. This year has also seen an increase in our social media contacts, raising awareness throughout York Region and our plan is to continue to grow this aspect of the organization.

As our fiscal year wrapped up in March 2021, we were one full year into the pandemic and only starting to realize the full extent of the shadow pandemic of complex mental health issues that have arisen. Oasis has started making plans to work with our community partners to offer additional online supports such as monthly webinars covering health and wellbeing, Advanced Care Planning, and Self Care, that support the complex grief that the world will be dealing with long after the physical health pandemic winds down.


Our Mission: To help all members of the York Region community navigate their grief journey by providing a central network of safe and valuable resources and support.


